Lewisham's VAWG COVID-19 response

Domestic violence and abuse is likely to increase during this period based on evidence from countries a few weeks ahead of us in this pandemic. In turn we want our VAWG partners to know that support is available for victims during this time.

Honour Based Violence

Honour based abuse is a collection of practices used to control behaviour within families in order to protect perceived cultural and religious beliefs and/or honour.

Violence can occur when perpetrators perceive that a relative has shamed the family and/or community by breaking their honour code.

Women are predominantly (but not exclusively) the victims, which can be distinguished from other forms of violence, as it is often committed with some degree of approval and/or collusion from family and/or community members.

Males can also be victims, sometimes as a consequence of their involvement in what is deemed to be an inappropriate relationship, if they are gay, or if they are believed to be supporting the victim.

Honour based abuse cuts across all cultures, nationalities, faith groups and communities, usually where a culture is heavily male dominated. Relatives, including females, may conspire, aid, abet or participate in honour based abuse, for what might seem a trivial transgression.^[1]

Forms of 'honour'-based violence

'Honour'-based violence includes:

- Forced marriage
- Domestic violence (physical, sexual, emotional or financial abuse)
- Sexual harassment and sexual violence (rape and sexual assault or threat of rape and sexual assault)
- Threats to kill
- Social ostracism or rejection and emotional pressure
- Denial of access to children
- Pressure to go or move abroad

- House arrest and excessive restrictions of freedom
- Denial of access to the telephone, internet, or passport/key documentation
- Isolation from friends and own family [2]

What possible offences are being committed?

Honour based abuse is a serious offence which can involve a number of crimes:

- Common assault
- Domestic abuse
- Forced marriage
- Cruelty to persons under 16 (including neglect and abandonment)
- Failure to secure regular attendance at school of a registered pupil
- Theft (e.g. passport)
- Child abduction
- Abduction of an unmarried girl under the age of 16 from parent or guardian
- Abduction of a woman by force or for the sake of her property
- Forced repatriation
- Rape
- Aiding and abetting a criminal offence
- Kidnapping
- False imprisonment
- Murder [1]

Spot the signs

You could be a victim of 'honour'-based violence if you feel threatened or are abused when you try to:

- Separate or divorce
- Start a new relationship
- Talk to or interact freely with men
- Become pregnant or give birth outside of marriage
- Have interfaith relationships or marry outside a specified religion
- Have sex before marriage
- Marry a person of your own choice

Honour Based Violence during lockdown

During this period of "lockdown" where we have no choice but to stay at home, Karma Nirvana have seen on the helpline an increased amount of calls relating to this form of abuse, by not just partners but in-laws too. One caller described feeling like a slave within the house – being made to cook/clean and provide for the family, whilst working full time and feeling unwell. Many victims we speak to are sworn at, isolated, beaten, sexually abused and treat like slaves.

Please, whilst we are being told by the government to "stay at home" remember that "home" – for some, is not a safe place to be and can mean increased abuse.^[3]

Karma Nirvana – National Honour Based Statistics

"As we report data as per fiscal year, in 2019/20 we supported 252 victim cases living in the London Met area of jurisdiction. Of those 252 victims, we know that 6 were living in Lewisham. Since the 1st of April 2020, we supported 91 victims living in the London Met area of jurisdiction, none of whom we know were living in Lewisham.

We receive calls from victims all over the UK who do not disclose where they are living, so we can only report on what victims share, and what professionals supporting victims who contact us know"

If you are in danger and unable to talk on the phone, call 999 and then press 55. This will transfer your call to the relevant police force who will assist you without you having to speak. [3]
